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# **Aircraft Charter Safety Ratings And What They Mean To You**

When you are deciding on an aircraft charter company, it is essential to establish whether the charter company you happen to be considering fulfills the highest safety standards possible.

The FAA (Federal Aviation Administration) performs a long certification procedure before even allowing a jet charter operator the power to fly the general public. Also, the Federal Aviation Administration provides continual oversight of the provider in the course of annual base inspections, in conformity inspections for adding new planes to their certificate, and through semi-annual assessments of the pilots. Nearly all charter owners make an effort to fulfill a higher safety standard than that governed by the Federal Aviation Administration. By way of example, the FAA requires that aircraft captains possess 1200 hours of flight experience. Nearly all operators have a minimum requirement of 2500 hours while the very best operators demand around 5000 hours of working experience.

A number of institutions have formulated industry safety specifications for aircraft charter operations to help to unify these specifications. They're Aviation Research Group/US (ARG/US), Wyvern, the Air Charter Safety Foundation and also International Business Aviation Council (IBAC).

ARG/US is likely the most well-known of the aviation safety standards organizations. They rate charter organizations within these classes; DNQ (does not qualify), Gold, Gold Plus and Platinum. A Gold provider meets the basic ARG/US safety specifications. The Gold Plus designation is presented to an operator that meets the basic standards and has participated in either an ARG/US audit of its operations and procedures or has acquired IS-BAO registration. The Platinum status is given to those companies that fulfill the basic safety requirements, pass the on-site review and in addition have both a Safety Management System along with an Emergency Response Plan set up.

Wyvern has long been highly regarded inside the charter industry for its high standards. The Wyvern Standard contains such requirements for the pilots as at least 4000 hours of flight experience with specific additional flight time requirements connected to actual time in type of aircraft. Wyvern puts out the Pilot and Aircraft Safety Survey (PASS) document on request that indicates whether the provider, crew and aircraft you have chosen meet either a basic safety standard or satisfy the Wyvern Standard. Those operators that pass Wyvern's rigorous review procedures become Wyvern "recommended". The expression "recommended" is the only expression that signifies the jet charter service has satisfied Wyvern's higher standard.

The Air Charter Safety Foundation strives to improve basic safety standardization across the charter sector. The ACSF Industry Audit Standard was developed with the feedback and assistance of leading safety auditors, charter providers, shared aircraft ownership companies and also charter customers.

One particular standard encompasses global jet charter standards – the IS-BAO, which actually means International Standard of Business Aircraft Operations. This code of the best practices was unveiled by the International Business Aviation Council and has also been generally used as the gold standard for company aircraft procedures. It has been supported by the National Business Aviation Association (NBAA) along with international institutions worldwide. Audits aren't offered by the organization, but rather by impartial, third party auditors that are certified by the International Business Aviation Council (IBAC).

Be certain that the aircraft charter operator you might be thinking about meets at the least one, if not even more, of these standards.
