Applying For A Priority U.S. Passport For A Child

It is important to understand all of the requirements when applying for an [rush passport for a minor](#). By law, all minors under the age of eighteen must have a passport before traveling abroad. There are a number of ways to get a new passport. The method you choose will depend on how soon you need the passport. It is important to have all of the required documents in advance, to make the application process easier and faster.

U.S. Citizens may apply for a passport at any government issuing passport agency. The applications are available at the various regional offices. There are staff members present to help you with any questions. You must bring your supporting documents with you to complete the process on your visit. Or you can pick up an application and return with your documents at a later date. If you do not know the location of your passport agency, go to their website and do a search based on your zip code.

In order to process your child's passport application, you will be required to have proof of citizenship and proof of ID. This will be specified on the application form. You will also need to provide recent passport photos of your child.

When applying for a passport through the normal routes, it takes between a month and a month and a half to receive your new passport. Government agencies do however provide expedited service for an additional fee. This expedited service cannot guarantee your passport by a specific time. Expedited service is typically three weeks shorter than the normal service.

Children's [United States passports](#) expire after five years. They cannot renew their passports like adults. Instead, they have to apply for a new passport. A quicker way of doing this is to apply online. But in cases where you will need a passport in a matter of days not weeks, there are outside agencies that offer emergency service.

Many online companies offer services where they can get you a passport very quickly. Some offer services that will get you a new passport in less than 24 hours. There are extra fees associated with these expedited services. And before you decide to go with one of these companies it is important to check their credentials.

It is important to make sure that the passport company is affiliated with the United States Department of State. The company is also required to be affiliated with the United States Passport Agency. If they are not, do not do business with them. You do not want to send sensitive information to companies that are not legitimate.

If you decide to use an online passport issuing company, for faster service, you will still need to send the same documents you would to a government agency. Applicants must send the child's proof of citizenship, and identifying information as well as standard passport photos. The application must be fully completed and it will be reviewed by the issuing agency.

Many of these online passport companies will provide additional assistance for travelers. Their customer service may include experts that will go over the documents with you to make sure everything was completed correctly. They may also have staff that can answer other questions regarding other travel documents needed to enter a particular country. There is a substantial added cost to using [quick child's passport](#) services, but when you are in a crunch and do not have time to apply for a passport through normal routes, they can be a real life saver.
